Katinka Bock 'Radio Piombino'

'Radio Piombino' is an exhibition of new sculptural works by the Paris-based, German artist, Katinka Bock. Responding to the peculiarities of the building as well as the particular history and nature of Glasgow, this is the first exhibition of her work in Scotland.

Bock works with a range of materials, including natural substances, such as copper, lead and clay and found or given forms. Her materials are often altered through natural processes and the effects of time – heat, moisture or sunlight, for example – such that the potential of becoming or disintegrating seems constantly present.

In the lead up to the exhibition, several parts of these works inhabited the city of Glasgow and its environs: copper oxidised outdoors; fabric was exposed to the elements; ceramic forms 'lived' in various locations, both indoors and out. These elements, in their (possibly) transformed states, are gathered to create a landscape of sculptural forms that turn the building into what Bock terms a "poisoned body".
