**Exhibition Akram Zaatari THE END Of TIME**8 April – 19 June 2016

In a new exhibition for The Common Guild, Lebanese artist Akram Zaatari presents a selection of works that reflect his interest in the documentary image and its place in the shaping of history. Zaatari's work, which combines the approaches of historian and artist, focuses on the individual and highlights his view that "diversity is the most important factor in resisting misrepresentation".

Zaatari has an expansive practice that reflects on the collection, archive and dissemination of images and the role they play in the formation of identities and histories. This sensibility is formed by living through 15 years of war in Lebanon and recording it as a teenager. He has spent much of the past decade collecting and studying the photographic history of the Middle East.

Zaatari is co-founder of the groundbreaking Arab Image Foundation, an artist-driven organisation with a collection of over 600,000 images, established in 1997 to preserve and study photographs from the region. He has made invaluable and uncompromising contributions to the wider discourse on preservation and archival practice and played a critical role in developing the formal, intellectual, and institutional infrastructure of Beirut's contemporary art scene. Zaatari participated in Documenta13 and represented Lebanon at the Venice Biennale 2013.
