The Common Guild is delighted to announce the first solo presentation in Scotland by the acclaimed Berlin-based, Georgian artist Thea Djordjadze. The exhibition continues The Common Guild's commitment to introducing significant and compelling international artists to Scotland.

Djordjadze's sculptures range from intimate hand-held objects to large architectural forms. Often referencing the body through the suggestion of clothing or furniture, her sculptures allude to familiar forms through their scale, shape and surface. Despite this familiarity, her work often appears to come from another time or place, or to suggest a previous existence or forthcoming use.

Working with a range of commonplace materials such as plaster, cardboard, wood and fabric, Djordjadze creates fragile, hand-made objects that appear partially constructed and partially destroyed. Djordjadze presents these hand-made objects alongside found items such as photographs, carpets and clothing suggesting ritualistic use or religious shrines. By utilising display mechanisms like shelves, plinths, tables and cabinets within the work she aligns the objects with something between the ethnographic museum and the fetishised collection.

For her exhibition at The Common Guild, Thea Djordjadze will make new work for the grand domestic spaces at 21 Woodlands Terrace.

1. Thea Djordjadze was born in Tbilisi, Georgia, in 1971, she lives and works in Berlin, Germany. She studied at the Academy of Arts, Tbilisi, the Gerrit Rietveld Academy in Amsterdam, and the Staatliche Kunstakademie Düsseldorf with professors Dieter Krieg and Rosemarie Trockel.

Djordjadze has had numerous solo exhibitions including Contemporary Art Museum St. Louis, 2011, Foksal Gallery Foundation, Warsaw, 2010, Kunsthalle Basel, 2009, and Kunstverein Nürnberg, 2008.

Recent group exhibitions include 'Time Again', Sculpture Center, New York, 2011, The New Décor, Hayward Gallery, London, 2010, 'Mental Archeology', Kunstverein Nürnberg, 2009-10, BB5 - 5th Berlin Biennial for Contemporary Art, 2008, and the 9th Biennale de Lyon, 2007

2. The Common Guild is a visual arts organisation based in Glasgow. It was established in 2006 and presents a dynamic, international programme of contemporary visual art projects, exhibitions, and events. These include gallery-based exhibitions at our current premises as well as non-gallery, one-off projects, talks and collaborations.
